

## **Real Community Radio Network, Inc.**

### **Established Local Applicant and Diversity Status**

The initial meeting of the incorporators of Real Community Radio Network, Inc. (the “Applicant”) occurred March 10, 2005 in Cabool, Missouri. During the summer of 2005 several additional meetings were held and they decided to incorporate for the purpose, among other things, of creating news and informational programming for distribution through various media in the community. The initial Articles of Incorporation (“Articles”) and Bylaws for the Applicant were adopted, and officers elected on August 8, 2005. The Articles were filed with the state of Missouri on August 19, 2005. After a requested modification of the Articles by the state the Articles were resubmitted on September 29, 2005, and approved by the state on October 28, 2005.

The Applicant’s principal office and primary physical headquarters has been in Cabool since the Applicant’s inception in 2005. Following the adoption of the Applicant’s Articles and Bylaws, it started holding a series of workshops in Cabool to train and educate volunteers about various aspects of the media (it has held at least eight such workshops to date, with the first on August 12, 2005). Since its inception the Applicant also has taken part in various community activities including the Ozark Area Community Congress (October 2005); it has produced an informational brochure about railroad accidents and the dangers they pose; it recorded the Cabool Teacher’s Association Candidate Forum that was made available to the public on CD (no commercial station covered the event); it produced a booklet “Making Positive Changes in Our Government;” and its directors have spoken to numerous community groups to inform them of the Applicant’s efforts and sign-up participants for workshops and as volunteers.

Neither the Applicant, nor any of its officers or directors have any interest in any other radio station.

Section 1.3(d) of the Applicant’s Bylaws (submitted as an attachment to Exhibit 2 of the application), includes provisions requiring the Applicant to “maintain the characteristics necessary to be an “established local entity,” pursuant to Section 73.7003(b)(1) of the Federal Communication’s rules and to provide “local diversity of ownership” pursuant to Section 73.7003(b)(2) of the Federal Communications Commission’s rules with respect to any application filed by the corporation for a permit to construct a noncommercial educational radio station.”
